

Dear Parents / Carers, 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2018

I hope you all had a super half term break and recharged your batteries ready for this very long lead up to Christmas—in total this is an 8 week term. Thinking ahead, the Friends of Brading will be holding a meeting on Thursday starting at 9am at school to discuss Christmas events. Everyone is welcome and there will be lots of tea and cake—please come along. The poster on the third page of the newsletter will provide you with more information. We have also added provisional Christmas dates to the diary on page two, please make sure you are aware of what's going on as it's always a busy time. If any dates or times change we will let you know as soon as possible.

Thanks to all who attended the parent/carer sessions, I have heard fabulous feedback and I am very proud of all how well the children are getting on this early in the academic year. If you didn't manage to meet with your child's class teacher, please pop a note in their planner and the teacher can arrange a time for you.

If you are attending firework displays or bonfires this weekend, here are some helpful tips to make sure you keep safe:

- 1. Only adults should deal with setting up the fireworks, lightening the fireworks and disposing of them after.
- 2. Children and young people should be supervised and all spectators should watch from a safe distance.
- 3. If you are having your own display, make sure you have planned ahead to make sure it is safe and finishes before 11pm.
- 4. Follow the instructions on each firework (some may be different than others) and never return to a firework once lit
- 5. Light the firework at arms length with a taper and stand well back making sure it is directed away from spectators.
- 6. Keep naked flames, including cigarettes away from fireworks and never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire.
- 7. An adult should be responsible for a bonfire and it should be away from fences, sheds or where children are playing.
- 8. Avoid wearing any loose clothing and tie back long hair
- 9. Make sure there is a bucket of water handy in case of an accident.

Remember all children in Foundation Stage up to Year 2 are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal. For those who bring in a packed lunch from home, taster pots are always available to encourage them to try a hot school dinner. They can also order a school sandwich, baguette or jacket potato.

If your child will be turning 3 years old prior to 31<sup>st</sup> December, they will be eligible for 15 hours of free early years education from January 2019. In addition, if eligible (e.g. you, and any partner, earn on average at least £120 a week), you could also be entitled to an additional 15 hours of funding. Two year old funding is available from 1st January, 1st April or 1st September following your child's 2nd birthday for families receiving certain benefits (e.g. Income support or Jobseeker's Allowance). We are now accepting applications for children to start with us after Christmas. We understand that the requirements of each child and each family are different and we are proud to offer a flexible early years facility which has been designed to provide an individually tailored approach for you and your child's needs. Whether you are looking for childcare for a few sessions or for the whole week, we are committed to ensuring your child/children are cared for in an environment where they will feel safe, happy and nurtured.
