Pupil Premium is a grant provided to enhance educational opportunity for children in families of low income. The grant includes the provision of free school meals. This is one aspect of support available to families of low income. Your child may be eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant. Please see Miss Hughes where she can provide you with a form to fill out. It means your child gets a super meal and the school gets more funding!

Breakfast club is available every day from 8am for children in all year groups. It costs just £2 per session, and there is no need to book. We do ask that the money is paid either in advance or on the day – we cannot carry outstanding money forward. Children in Reception class up to year 4 will need to be signed in by a parent or guardian upon arrival.
