Wow what an amazing and busy week! So much has been happening in school. Today we have had a fantastic community afternoon where we have been working with groups in the Brading community. As I mentioned last week, this is to develop our community days during the summer holidays. Thank you so much to everyone who helped today and to everyone who came along and supported the afternoon. Also, thank you to everyone who came in wearing yellow today to raise money for the Cystic Fibrosis Trust and the Earl Mountbatten Hospice, two very worthy causes. Once the money has been counted we will let you know how much we have raised. Our next fundraising event will be the Summer Fayre to raise funds for the Friends of Brading.

Today a small group of year 6 children had the opportunity to go sailing with Sir Ben Ainslie followed by high tea and a Q&A session. I know he is one of Mrs Powell's idols, so she and the children have been looking forward to this afternoon for quite some time! I can't wait to hear all about it on Monday.

Mrs Skelley's class had a fabulous time at the Isle of Wight Steam Railway on Tuesday (despite the weather!). We are currently in the process of organising staffing for the new academic year. We have found that this course has provided us with additional strategies and skills to support children and families. Thank you for your help and support with this.



# **Alex Timpson Attachment and Trauma Programme in Schools**

# **Information for Parents about Pupil Questionnaire**

Your child's school is taking part in the national Alex Timpson Attachment and Trauma Programme in Schools. The Rees Centre, at the University of Oxford, is using this programme to try to find out how schools can better support children and young people who might struggle at school. More than 300 schools are taking part.

#### Why is this needed?

Sometimes pupil's emotions and behaviour are particularly difficult for school staff. They don't feel confident to work with young people who have experienced trauma and/or neglect. The Programme has been designed to address this, through helping staff to develop whole school approaches to behaviour. We need to find out what schools do that better support young people who have had trauma or been neglected.

#### Who is involved?

We would like to know what pupils think about being a part of their school and how they feel. In order to find that out, all children are being invited to take part in completing a short on-line survey in school. Taking part is voluntary. Choosing not to take part will not affect the child or the school. If you are happy for them to be involved, then no further action is needed. If you have concerns, please return the attached form to your child's school, or contact us directly.

#### How will the information be used?

The survey of pupils will provide important information on how we can do things better in schools across England. It will identify better training and support for staff and could influence how money is spent in the future. Young people, teachers and other staff are all involved in giving their views to make sure it is relevant, realistic and reaches as many people as possible.

# Who will have access to the research data?

Qualtrics who run the on-line survey will only collect anonymised data i.e. the survey data will not be linked to children's names or other personal information. Only this anonymised survey data will be passed to the University of Oxford to evaluate the Alex Timpson Attachment and Trauma Programme in Schools. The anonymised data will also be passed on the University of Exeter and will contribute to a national study on children's well-being - you can see more about their work here: http://medicine.exeter.ac.uk/hifams/

The research data will be securely stored for seven years after completion of the study, after that it will be securely disposed of.

#### Who will have access to personal data?

In order to complete the on-line survey, pupils will need to register with Atto Partners, who are administering the survey on our behalf. When registering pupils will be asked their name (i.e. personal data). Personal data will be held by Atto Partners who are the 'data controller' for this information. They are responsible for looking after it in accordance with General Data Protection Regulation and associated data protection legislation.

Personal data is only stored and will only be used for the purposes of inviting pupils to complete the survey. Atto Partners need this information to make sure participation in the survey is as smooth as possible, and to make it easier for the school to distribute the survey. Having this information allows the research team to analyse how survey answers change over time, without having to identify pupils, as Atto will not pass on any personal information, just a code to identify different pupils who have responded to the survey.

#### How can you find out more?
