Just to inform you the price of dinners will be rising to £2.05 (10.25 per week) from September 2019.

Island Roads on behalf of the Isle of Wight Council give notice that between 0630 hours and 1800 hours on approximately 5 to 10 **days**, or when the works have been completed, whichever is the sooner; that no vehicle or person may use, or cause any animal to use the following roads; and that no vehicle is permitted to wait on the following roads or within 50 metres on any adjoining side road where indicated by traffic signs. The closures are for carriageway and footway repairs, resurfacing, drainage works, verge maintenance and kerbing works between Friday 5 July 2019 and Friday 16 August 2019. It may be necessary to close this section of road on more than one occasion within this timeframe. The exact dates of the works will be confirmed on the Island Roads website at www.islandroads.com or ring on 01983 822440:

The Isle of Wight Council (Lower Furrongs, Brading, Isle of Wight) (Temporary Road Closure and Parking Restrictions) Order No 1 2019 – Lower Furrongs will be closed for its entire length. The alternative route will be signposted locally.
