Dear Parents/Carers

Outstanding forms

Thank you to everyone who has returned completed data, EV3 and E-Safety forms, however we do still have some outstanding. Can these please be returned to school via class teachers or direct to the office by Friday 5th October. If you have misplaced any of the forms just let the office know and they can send home a duplicate.

Medication

Just a reminder regarding medicine – we are only able to administer medicine in school that has been prescribed by the GP which is to be taken **4 times a day for year 1 upwards – EYFS is three times a day**. The medicine must be from a pharmacy and have a printed label on it with your child's name and the dosage that is required. Unfortunately, without this we will not be able to administer your child's medication. Forms must be completed in the office for medication prior to your child having it.

Headlice

We've had reports of headlice, and as many of you are aware, they can cause problems both at home or in school. Please try to check your child's hair regularly and if you see any headlice then treat both them and the whole family, as well as keeping long hair tied back.

Lunch boxes

We do require the children to bring in lunch boxes which are hard plastic and washable, please refrain from sending in the canvas type. I do have some plastic ones in my office which you are welcome to have, please let the office know.

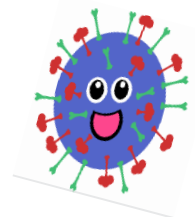

Cuba

This week we have had lots of fun continuing on the story Jack and the Beanstalk. We have been very busy planting our own seeds, measuring beanstalks, decorating magic beans and using magnifying glasses to explore the inside of runner beans.



Antigua

Malta

In Computing, the children have looked at a range of codes and have started to build a programme where their characters can repeat instructions. On Friday, the children completed a non-chronological report on Stonehenge and presented their facts and findings to the class.

Maldives

In English, we have been busy writing our versions of 'The Three Little Pigs.' The writing from all the children is showing progress already so well done! In maths, we have been looking at greater than, less than and equal to. We have got active in PE. and had fun in music. The children have also been working hard on their phonics and reading and are getting better every day with blending and segmenting.

Jamaica

In English we wrote a persuasive letter as Shackleton asking for money for an expedition. Then, in maths, we did multiplication. In guided reading we answered questions on a fictional text. Also, in geography, we searched the climate for 3 different cities. In science we learnt about the different classes of animals. For art, we did prints inspired by Giuseppe Arcimboldo. In PE we played a game called Endzone. In topic, we learnt about online safety on Interland. In assembly we learnt about courage and the harvest festival.

Hawaii

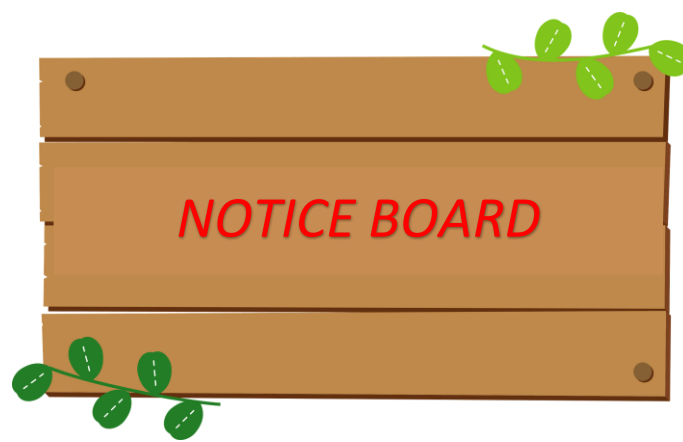

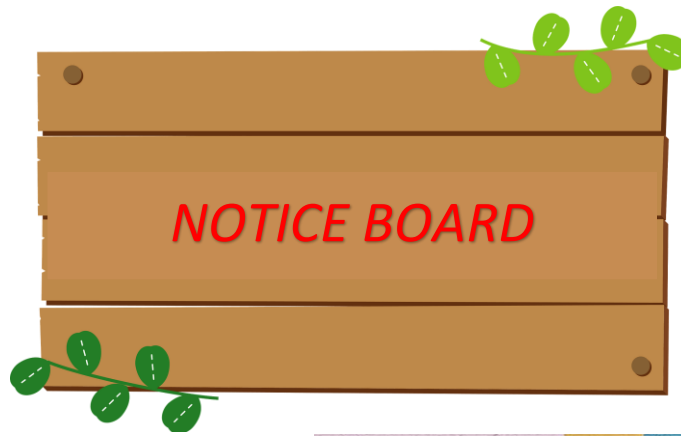

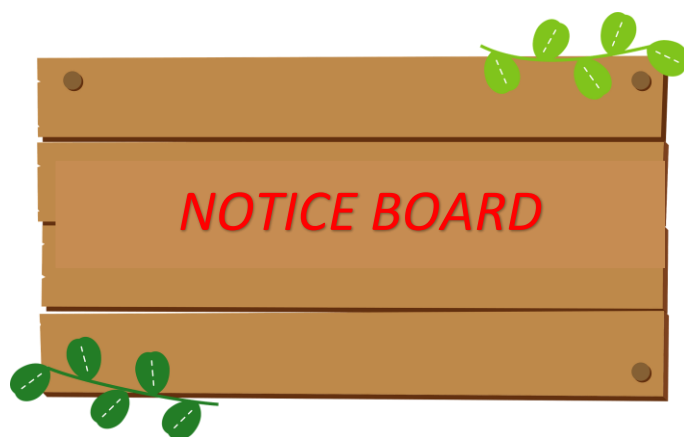
