
WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNNING THIS WEEK?				
ANTIGUA	"This week in Antigua class we have continued with space! We made a whole galaxy of planets using balloons after learning all about the different planets and their colour/size. We conducted experiments using foam and glitter to make moon rocks. We have also focused on team work and how to work together. We made bridges to cross rivers and helped each other to cross and balance without falling in!"			
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia we have moved onto our topic Space! The book of the week this week was 'Whatever Next'. We built rockets to go to space just like the characters. We wrote a list and drew son things we would take to space with us, most importantly sweets!			
MALDIVES	Year 1 has been busy learning about fact families in maths. In English we have been looking at instruc- tions as Nibbles is on the loose!! In history we have started to look at The Great Fire of London. We have created our spirituality board and are very keen to tell everybody about it.			
NEW ZEALAND	This week in Year 2, our pupils embarked on an exciting English letter-writing journey, inspired by the charming tale of "The Day the Crayons Quit." Imagination and creativity flowed as they expressed their thoughts through letters. In Science, we delved into understanding what keeps us healthy, exploring the significance of a balanced lifestyle. Geography lessons were filled with curiosity as pupils enthusiastically named and located the five oceans, broadening their global awareness. Additionally, our Religious Education day focused on the anticipation of Advent, fostering spiritual reflection and understanding.			
MALTA	This week in Malta class we have spent our science lesson looking at different skeletons and recognising the differences between humans and animals. The children explored the differences between vertebrates and invertebrates and labelled diagrams to show this. In P.E, the children played handball and started to learn some of the key skills needed. This weeks English focus has been formal letter writing. The children have annotated a formal letter and recognised the features needed to write a successful piece for a recipient.			
GALAPAGOS	This week year 4 have been learning all about road safety including what to wear in these darker winter months and how to safely cross the road. As well as this we have been thinking about spirituality and our school values and have made pictures to go in each quadrant of our spirituality board to represent self, others, beauty and faith.



Appointments must be booked in advance using the National Booking Service, we are unable to offer walk-ins.

- or have not had any COVID vaccination in the past.




