What we have been learning this week...

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ANTIGUA	This week in Antigua class we have continued with our theme "Discovering Dinosaurs". We have been busy making some super dinosaur skeleton salt dough models, explored dinosaur moulds in the glitter, completed some rather funky dinosaur puzzles and did the Dino Pokey dance! On top of our fabulous dinosaur discoveries this week we have been practicing life skills such as putting our own coats and shoes on, washing our hands, cutting our own fruit and pouring our own drinks.
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia we have been continuing our mini beasts theme, our book of the week this week was mad about minibeasts. We loved learning about all the different minibeasts, we made clay minibeasts, drew them, used adjectives to describe the minibeasts and sorted them into categories
MALDIVES	 Year one have written thank-you letters for their toys from the past workshop. Every single child created their best piece of writing to date showing their progress - I am so proud! In maths, we have been looking at doubles and near doubles. In phonics, we have started to look at alternative graphemes and the children have been completely immersed in their learning. Reading continues to go from strength to strength and I hope that they are sharing their skills with you. In history, we have been comparing Brading from the past to present day. In science, we have been looking at evergreen and deciduous trees. We had a visit from our governor this week who was extremely impressed with the children's behaviour and attitude to learning. Keep up the good work year one!
NEW ZEALAND	 What a fantastic week we've had in New Zealand class! In English, we've been exploring the delightful adventures of Minik, inspired by the book "Big Bear, Little Brother." We had an amazing time finishing our diary entries as Minik, using our imaginations to describe his exciting escapades. Over in Maths, we've been mastering the concepts of length and height. We've been measuring objects around us, comparing their sizes, and learning how to use the appropriate units. Finally, in PE, the energy levels were through the roof as we continued our dance routine
MALTA	to the iconic song "Thriller." The children have been grooving and moving, showing off their impressive dance moves.This week in Malta class we have been studying the water cycle and it's importance in forming seasons. On Monday, the children designed water cycle plates and learnt the steps of evaporation, condensation and precipitation. In English, we have taken our topic and wrote a descriptive narrative from the perspective of a rain drop travelling through the water cycle. On Wednesday, the children looked at reflective surfaces in science. We
GALAPAGOS	 designed reflective rucksacks and recognised which materials reflected more than others. We have had a very busy week this week! We've been learning about human and physical features of Spain in geography, finishing our fact files about Spain in English and have been working hard on understanding improper fractions in maths. We've even started a bit of street dance and showed off more of our balancing and climbing prowess in PE.
ICELAND	In maths this week we are learning percentages and decimals. In topic we are learning Urban and Rural and we were identifying the features of the places there. In science we were learning about properties of materials and scientific reactions of two materials mixing together. In English we are writing an Anglo Saxon report of what happened when Mr Cooper came to our school so we could learn more about the Anglo Saxons. In P.E we were doing infinite cricket which is there is a cone at either side of the room and there is a cricket stump behind us and we had to run to the cone and back to make sure you get there in time and the stump doesn't get hit or falls over.
