What we have been learning this week				
ANTIGUA	This week in Antigua class we have been bug explorers! All things mini beasts and creepy crawlies. We have been on bug hunts where we found a spider, some woodlice, a beetle, some worms and a snail. We have explored a wiggly worm tray using pinchers and grabbers to catch as many worms as we can. We made repeated pattern caterpillars using the shape "circle" and also had lots of fun making spider webs using tape.			
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia we have carried on our Mini-beasts topic and this week our book focus has been "if only". We learnt the life cycle of a butterfly, the children enjoyed retelling the story and celebrating what makes us unique and being happy in our own skin! The children's favourite activity this week was matching the numeral to the lady bird spots!			
	Science week - in St Lucia celebrating science week we have investigated the separation of materials using milk, soap and food colouring. We learnt that because milk is mostly water with a high fat content, mixed with the soap it doesn't let the food colouring mix together so it makes a beautiful rainbow! Secondly we cut up lemons, coloured them using a pipette and food colouring, added soap and baking soda, due to the lemons being acidic, it reacted with the other ingredients and exploded! The children loved getting messy and watching the amazing chemical reaction			
MALDIVES	take place! They then really impressed me writing their method and results. Well done St Lucia! Firstly, I want to say a massive thank you to those of you who were able to join us for our end of science week celebration. The children were amazing (as always) and were very proud to share their work with you. For those of you unable to join us there are a few			
	photographs of our 'eggsperiment.' In Design & Technology, we made cup and ball games as a modern day version from our toys of the past workshop. In English, we are now writing instructions to accompany them. In maths, we have been looking at subtracting and related facts. We attended an online 'feelings' workshop as part of PSHE. We are in assessment week for phonics and yet again the children have exceeded my expectations. Best wishes Mrs Attwell			
NEW ZEALAND	It's been an exciting week in New Zealand class! In maths, we've been diving into volume, capacity, and temperature. We have been measuring and comparing different containers and looking at if they are full or empty. Our school trip to Amazon World was a blast! We got up close with different habitats and learned all about the amazing creatures that call them home. The children's enthusiasm and curiosity made the trip a memorable learning experience. We're also kicking off our new writing journey with a recount of our school trip. The children are eagerly sharing their favourite moments and details from the trip, and they're doing a fantastic job at capturing their experiences in writing.			
MALTA	This week in Malta class we have been busy focusing on kindness. As part of our PSHE, we had a workshop and looked at how we can be kind to our bodies. The children thought about what humans need to stay alive, and what people need to stay hygienic. On Wednesday, the children spent the afternoon looking further into the water cycle and looked at the fourth step of transpiration. As part of our science week, the children have been carrying out practical investigations. The children used their observations to enhance their understanding.			

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What we have been learning this week				
GALAPAGOS	Galapagos have had a very fun week this week. The children came in on Monday to find that all the stationary had quit as part of our hook into our new book, The Day the Crayons Quit. We've had lots of fun acting out the different personalities and creating our own characters. We've also been undertaking activities for science week this week. This year the topic is time so the children spent time learning about the science behind sundials and even got to make their own! Luckily the weather was even on our side!			
ICELAND	This week in science we did some experiments on how to separate materials but some of the experiments where irreversible. We conducted sand and water, sand and paper clips and so on. The topic that we are learning about is properties and materials. We have tried different methods of separation using filter paper, sieves and even magnets. We are waiting on our results for the sugar and water evaporation experiment. In pe we have been doing basket ball and in maths we have been doing perimeter, in English we have carried on with our Anglo-Saxon recount. By George			
JAMAICA	This week in year 6 we have had an amazing week! I English we have been learning SPAG and writing a recount. This week in maths we have been learning about pie charts, geometry and doing small arithmetic papers. In guided reading we have been finishing off past SATs papers and doing general questions on different texts. In science we have done a small experiment including pens, paper and water to show us what pen colours are made of other colours. In topic we have looked at the UK's imports and exports. In collective worship we have done TRUST. On Monday we found out that KS2 was going to church service next Monday. On Tuesday we learnt about what Mary had to trust and how did she have to. On Wednesday we had a collective worship about gossiping and who we can trust not to gossip.			
CUBA	This week in Cuba Class we have continued working on our topic on the farm. We started the week exploring vegetable printing and seeing what different marks we could make. We then read the three little pigs and had lots of making fun our own little piglets. The children have then worked so hard this week matching letters together and finding capital letters and little letters that are the same!			
	We have had lots of exciting fun on science week. Firstly, we had a tuff tray full of coloured ice and we had to try and find ways to melt the ice. As the ice was melting we were able to use the colour from it to make marks. Then we mixed together vinegar, bicarbonate of soda and food colouring to make a frothy coloured mixture. Some of the children were using the word volcano to describe how it looked.			
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class, the children have been thinking about how they can work as a team. They have been giving each other challenges, completing group tasks and some children have been taking part in a Lego club. They have also been spotting mistakes in sentences by finding the missing words. In Geography, the children discussed animals that live in different habitats and how the animals are different. In science, the children have been exploring microhabitats and minibeasts found in different habitats.




