We are now accepting applications for new Early Years Children to start with us after Christmas and spaces are filling up fast.



In addition, if eligible, you could also be entitled to an additional 15 hours of funding. Two year old funding is available from 1st January, 1st April or 1st September following your child's 2nd birthday for families receiving certain benefits. All applications for funding for the Spring term must be completed prior to 31st December 2019.

Dark Nights at The Roman Villa is a new outdoor arts event at Brading, which comprises a spectacular illuminated street parade and a community enactment of a fairy-tale pageant, devised and performed by local schoolchildren, their friends and families.


It is part of the East Wight Landscape Partnership's 'Down to the Coast' project which aims to engage local people in the understanding and celebration of their local landscapes and heritage. Dark Nights at the Villa is being organised by The New Carnival Company.

Expect to see giant puppets, fabulous costumes, choreographed dancers and epic drama. Expect to see Medusa, Bacchus, Orpheus and the inimitable Cockerel-headed man as never before! Expect a storyline inspired by the famous Roman Mosaics of the Villa. Expect an unforgettable experience.

Parking. You can park for free at the Villa for the pageant, but you must be in before 6.30pm when the gates will be closed for one hour. There is also limited parking

in Brading Town itself. Those joining the parade at Brading School should be aware that the route is linear, and should make arrangements for return to their vehicle at the end. There is no parking at the School.
