This week we have been busy developing the Cultural Capital side of our curriculum. Culture Capital is a new area that we are developing in line with the new changes to the curriculum. At Brading we believe Cultural Capital is aiming to open doors to new experiences and enrich the children's future success through varied and exciting life opportunities. Every week we will also let you know our school focus and how this links to Cultural Capital and our British Values, which are:

- 1. Democracy
- 2. Rule of Law
- 3. Individual Liberty and Mutual Respect
- 4. Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs

To support this, this week year 5 children took part in a Christmas event at Carisbrooke Castle. An enormous thank you to Mr Bosworth for organising this and taking the time on a Sunday afternoon to be with the group of year 5 children. The feedback was amazing. At the same time, our school Art club have been working closely with the Carnival Club, and over the weekend they took part in the Dark Nights at the Villa event. We are developing out Cultural Capital display in school where we will be displaying photographs of the event.

We have been lucky enough to secure a place in Isle Dance 2020 and it is open to up to 30 children across the school. They will be performing a dance on stage in February alongside other Island schools. It is an amazing opportunity and will leave long lasting memories – I can still remember when I did it many years ago!! If your child would like to take part please get a form from the office. It will be part of a performing arts after school club that will be part of the club timetable next term, so I need to know by next Friday so that spaces in the club can be allocated.

This week we had our Open Day for September 2020 starters. The feedback we got from prospective families was brilliant, a huge thank you to Mrs Lacey and the Zig Zag team for all their hard work in developing EYFS since September, and to the office team for doing the tours of the school.

Once again we are taking part in the Christmas tree festival at St Mary's church. To help us make our Christmas tree extraordinary, we are asking all the children to create their own Christmas tree decoration, with a prize for the best decoration in each year group. All decorations need to be named and brought into school by Thursday 28th November please – I look forward to seeing all the fabulous entries!

As ever we are looking at how we can continue to make everyone safe through our safeguarding developments. This week I have found a toolkit to help parents/carers discuss internet safety with children. The booklet is called 'Let's Talk about Life Online' and it includes 10 key messages that should be shared with children. They are:

- 1. "You can always come to me if you need help."
- 2. "What would you do if this happened...?"
- 3. "Remember that not everyone is who they say they are online."
- 4. "Keep your personal information safe, and other people's too."
- 5. "Be respectful to others online."
- 6. "Think before you post."
- 7. "Remember to ask if it's okay."
- 8. "Remember not everything is true online."
- 9. "The things other people post online might not always show what their life is really like."
- 10. "Recognise how going online makes you feel and take a break when you need to."

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
