Science week

This week the children have been undertaking lots of activities for science week. They have had lots and lots of fun, from experimenting with making Oobleck from Dr Seuss to seeing how different surfaces affect distance and speed. It has been so lovely to see all of the children enjoying themselves and being involved in working together as a team in all the different experiments they have been doing. Absences

There seems to be some confusion with absences. We have to be notified <u>on the day</u> of your child's absence either by phone or email before 9:30am. This <u>must</u> be followed up with a written letter or email explaining why your child was absent. Writing 'unwell' or 'feeling poorly' is not specific enough for our records, we are required to have this. In addition, for any medical appointments, we also need to have evidence such as an appointment card, letter or text. If we do not receive anything in writing from you, your child's absence will go down as <u>unauthorised</u>. We are regularly in contact with the Education and Inclusion Officer to monitor consistently late or absent children.

Questionnaires

Thank you to everyone who took the time to fill in the questionnaire that was sent out last week. It has been great to gain some insight on everyone's views and I will be going through all of the responses and provide you with an overview soon.

School lunches

Remember all children in Foundation Stage up to Year 2 are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal. For those who bring in a packed lunch from home, taster pots will be available on Thursday to encourage them to try a school lunch. They can also order a school sandwich, baguette or hot snack from the menu below.

Government updates

As I am sure you are all aware, national lockdown restrictions change as from Monday, where we move to step 3 of the roadmap. Once again I have been working with the Governing Body and the staff in regards to how things will change in school. The areas that affect us will be:

- 1. <u>Face coverings</u> will no longer be recommended for staff to use in classrooms or communal areas within school. However, they will still be required for all adults outside of the school building.
- 2. <u>Equipment</u> From Monday we will be allowing:
 - a) Lunchboxes can come into school but they must be plastic (no canvas thank you) and big enough to hold your child's water bottle that they bring in. All boxes must be washed daily.
 - b) Hats, with the weather getting hotter there are two options:
 - i) Attaching the hat to your child's coat
 - ii) If your child does not have a coat, then the hat must be in a named bag and must stay on their peg and not go home. The children will be responsible for their own hats and putting them bag into the bags.
 - c) <u>Sun cream</u> This needs to be put on before school. Sorry <u>we will not be</u> having sun cream in school.
 - d) P.E Kits We will continue with the children wearing their P.E kit to school on their P.E days.

As the Prime Minister has stated, we need to continue to be vigilant and cautious at the same time. Like I have said previously, we are only one of a handful of school's nationally and on the Island that have not had to shut any bubbles due to COVID on the school site and my aim is to get to the end of the academic year without having to. For this reason, I need us all to work together to be a TEAM that Trust each other.
