SchoolMoney update

On Wednesday afternoon the office staff undertook a training session with SchoolMoney, and on Thursday you should have all received a text and an email giving your unique password. You can use SchoolMoney via their website or using the Eduspot app. Dinners, breakfast club and wrap around care for the first week after half term are now available for you to book. Our plan is to be cashless by the Christmas holidays and we are hoping that this is a straightforward, easy system for you all to use. Unfortunately, we are unable to put snack onto SchoolMoney as this is through Chartwells, so please continue to send in your child's snack money in a sealed envelope with their order for the week.

Parent / carer sessions

We will be having our first parent/carer sessions of the year after half term. Once again this will be done through School Cloud. Mrs Mattick will be sending you all a link to choose your times when we come back to school. We find that by undertaking parent/carer sessions via School Cloud we have a higher uptake as you can do them from your phone, tablet or laptop. Fun Clubs

It has been amazing seeing all the brilliant activities taking place after school. Mrs Skelley will also be starting a KS2 Christmas club which will take place on Tuesday afternoons from 2:30 to 3:30. As this will run for a 7 week block the cost will be £7 and you will be able to book your child's space on SchoolMoney after the half term.

Behaviour policy

Over this half term, as a senior leadership team we have been working with all staff and parents to develop our up to date behaviour policy. We have slightly changed our school rules which are now:

- 1. Be kind
- 2. Follow instructions when asked
- 3. Only one voice (so everyone can learn)

The policy has also changed in regards to rewards and sanctions which are now related to zones of regulation, looking into golden time. The aim is for everyone to have golden time either daily or weekly depending on the age and needs of the children. However, their golden time activity will depend on how they have been. Our biggest focus is for the children to make good choices and as a team we are always making sure we engage in positive practice. Each class will be sending out information the first week back to update you on their golden time activities and the zones of behaviour we have agreed. I am more than happy to talk this through with you, please just let me know.

Skills builder

We have been extremely lucky to have been chosen to take part in the Skills Builder Project. There are 8 essential skills which are **Teamwork**, **Leadership**, **Aiming High**, **Staying Positive**, **Creativity**, **Listening**, **Speaking and Problem Solving**. These are all based on developing the skills for employment for the future. As children grow into adults, at school we aim to provide them with the learning to acquire new skills and knowledge for the curriculum. In addition to this when you are training for a job you're given the specific skills and knowledge for that particular job and skills builder is aimed at developing these skills to be able to be part of the workforce when the time is right. Our aim to is to develop our Brading children and we feel passionately that these skills will aid all the children across the whole school. Dangerous Toys

A recent commissioned by the British Toy and Hobby Association (BTHA) found many of the toys tested could choke, strangle, burn, poison and electrocute children. Out of the 255 toys that were randomly selected, inspected and tested, 88% were illegal and 48% were unsafe for a child to play with.

The toys tested were bought from a range of online sellers. Currently, there is no legal requirement for online marketplaces to check the safety of the products that other sellers are listing on their site.

The report itself includes a list of toys that researchers found were illegal or unsafe.

As we move towards the Christmas season, parents will be buying toys, and so the advice given in Appendix 8 of the report, Consumer Tips, could be especially valuable.
