THIS WEEK AT BRADING...

Antigua

In Early Years this week we have been celebrating world book day and we have had a fun week exploring lots of different stories. We explored Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Billy Goats Gruff and The Three Little Pigs further. We had fun acting out the stories and using the puppets too. We have also taken part in some cooking activities we made porridge and bear toast this week. Then on Wednesday we had a teddy bears picnic together.

Iceland

This week, Iceland class have been writing our instructions to make an omelette. In maths, we have been multiplying tenths and hundredths and in French we have been singing Old MacDonald. We have learnt what an irreversible reaction is and in geography, we have used a Venn diagram to see the differences between urban and rural areas. Finally, in PE we continued with dodgeball and hockey.

Malta

This week in Malta we have been busy creating a front cover for our text driver 'This is London'. As part of world book day, we decorated a large front cover and discussed the different features in the book. On Friday, we then wrote our descriptive pieces of writing based on our text driver and imagined we were guards at Buckingham Palace.

New Zealand

Year two have been designing new coats for Rainbow the Chameleon (our hook). In maths we have been comparing money and in English we are writing a persuasive letter to the woodcutter! We retold the story through drama. In geography, we have been locating animals around the world and linking them to hot and cold places. In science, we went on a learning walk with a focus on our habitat and we are continuing with dance in PE.

THIS WEEK AT BRADING...

Maldives

The children had a fun afternoon on Tuesday learning all about toys from the past with a visit from English Heritage. They were able to look and talk about toys from over 100 years ago and then play with replicas.

The children loved working out how the old toys worked, either clockwork, string or by spinning and all managed to have a go on all types.

In English we have completed our narrative rewriting Jack and the Beanstalk and in maths we have been working on addition within 20.









Hawaii

We have had a busy week in Hawaii Class exploring minibeasts in different ways and thinking about books we like and sharing them. The children used play doh to create a range of different minibeasts thinking about their features. We also had a library with books created about some favourite things.



Cuba

This week in Cuba class we have been having lots of fun practicing writing our letters in foam, sand and water. We have also been looking at the habitats of different minibeasts and matched up them up to their homes. We then designed and made our own minibeasts using lots of different materials like shells, cotton buds, pom poms and glitter.

Jamaica

This week in maths we were learning about graphs, the two we were learning about were line graphs and pie charts. So, if there was a half and two quarters the half would be 50% and two quarters would be 25% which would equal 100%. On Thursday we did a singing workshop where we had to sing sea shanties. The class's favourite was To Portsmouth. In English we were doing a setting description about the main character's room in our book The Misadventures of Frederick. In science we were learning about how we see in the light. Today we did a live lesson on World Book Day.





St Lucia

This week in St Lucia we have been exploring traditional tales as it is world book day this week! We have gone on a book scavenger hunt, acted out the stories, thought of alternative endings to our favourite stories and discussed right and wrong. We also designed a book cover, book marks and drew our own book character that we dressed up as for world book day!





WHAT ARE THE RISKS? NGL (which stands for 'Not Gonna Lie') is an app through which users share a link to their Instagram story or Twitter account, inviting their followers to give anonymous feedback. The app includes some prewritten questions (such as 'if you could change anything about me, what would it be?'), plus the option to ask followers to simply 'send me anonymous messages'. All replies go into the user's NGL inbox, with the sender remaining anonymous – although subscribers to the app can receive hints about who each message was from

Advice for Parents & Carers

DEALING WITH NEGATIVITY

Blocking another user on NGL will prevent them sending anonymous messages to your child in the short term — although a determined abuser could get around that obstacle simply by setting up a new Instagram account. If your child continually receives negative messages that upset them, it might be worth encouraging them to consider whether they really need to use the app at all.

EXPLAIN ANONYMOUS APPS

BLOCK IN-APP PURCHASES

To avoid your child running up an eye-watering bill through an NGL subscription (or indeed any kind of costly in-app purchases), go into the settings on whatever devices they use to go online and either disable the ability to make purchases or protect that function with a password. If those options aren't available, it's prudent to ensure there aren't any payment methods linked to their account.
