Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back, and welcome to the small number of families who have joined us. I hope you all enjoyed the break and the time with your families. Upcoming strike days

Following on from the correspondence sent home earlier in the week regarding the upcoming strike action, I can confirm that currently there are no further changes and the school will only remain partially closed. However, teachers do not need to inform me if they intend to act until the morning of the strike so please bear in mind that you may need to put childcare arrangements in place if there are any changes at the very last minute.

Coronation celebrations

As you know, King Charles will be coronated on Monday 8th May. To celebrate this special occasion, we will be having a Red, White and Blue mufti day on Friday 5th May and having a special lunch! In addition to this, the waste disposal team sent us photos to show that they were unable to collect our waste which now means we will have to wait until next week for our bins to be emptied – I am sure that you can appreciate as a busy school this will cause us difficulties. We are now accepting applications for children to join our Early Years after the summer holidays, and spaces are filling up fast. We understand that the requirements of each child and each family are different and we offer a flexible early years facility which has been designed to provide an individually tailored approach for you and your child's needs. Whether you are looking for childcare for a few sessions or for the whole week, we are committed to ensuring your children are cared for in an environment where they will feel safe, happy and nurtured.

If your child will be turning 3 years old prior to 31st August 2023, they will be eligible for 15 hours of free early years education from September 2023. In addition, if eligible (e.g. you, and any partner, earn on average at least £167 a week), you could also be entitled to an additional 15 hours of funding. Two year old funding is available from 1st January, 1st April or 1st September following your child's 2nd birthday for families receiving certain benefits (e.g. Income support or Jobseeker's Allowance). To check your family's eligibility for early years funding please visit www.childcarechoices.gov.uk

THIS WEEK AT BRADING...

Galapagos

We have had a really fun start to the new term! We have begun looking into the history of our Royal Family in history and started writing a story based on the Queen in English. We have also managed to get outside to start our tennis module in PE now that the weather is getting nicer!



Malta

This week in Malta class we have had a fantastic week starting our journey into the life of a Victorian child. On Wednesday, we had our Victorian school day and carried out a range of activities to match that of a Victorian child. The girls carried out needle work, whilst the boys took part in a technical drawing activity.



Cuba

Our topic this half term is people who help us. We have spent this week focusing on police. We used different chinks and pastels to print our finger prints on to paper and explore them. We also did yoga as a class and worked really hard to try all of the different yoga poses.



Antigua

This week in Antigua class we have been looking at Spring and enjoying our new outside play area. We went on a Spring walk to the field and did a treasure hunt for different spring flowers, which we collected in a basket. We then brought those back to the class and made spring collages. The children have had a lot of fun exploring the new climbing frame, mud kitchen and digging area.



Maldives

This week we have started our new text driver of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. The children have enjoyed acting out different parts of the story and describing how their character might be feeling at each point. In maths we have started our new domain of measurement and the children have been measuring objects (and each other!) with both standard and non-standard units of measurement. We also wrapped up our Toys from the Past topic and made a pull along toy (based on those we saw during our workshop from English Heritage) during our DT. A great first week back Maldives!

Hawaii

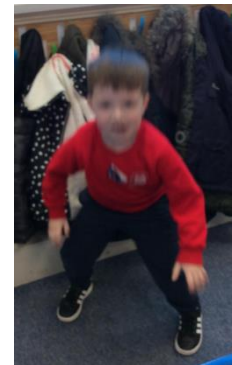
This week in Hawaii Class we have been exploring people who help us. The children took on the role of different people in the community including a vet, doctor, fireman and policeman. They used different tools to help the animals and babies and completed incident reports from different fires including the great fire of London. They also took finger prints from different children and adults.



New Zealand

'All Change' for year 2 this term. Our new topic is exactly that. We started with our new and exciting hook of a trip back through time to the 1950s. We had a 'rock and roll' session with Elvis Presley. We started our timeline looking at the 1950s and what the following looked like in the past: toys; television; music; fashion; school; and technology. Over the coming weeks we will travel through the decades. The last week of term, we will have a parent session where we will dress up from our favourite decade so please start thinking of outfits.

In maths, we have been investigating length and height as part of our measurement domain. In English, we have started thinking about instruction writing. We have looked at imperative verbs and expanded noun phrases to help us create our potions. In science, we have looked at healthy plants and what they need to flourish and grow. We have planted some beans and made predictions about what are the best conditions. Alongside all of this, we have also been working hard on SATs questions. Well done everybody and thank you for supporting your child at home with this.

This week in after school club we made a Walt Disney quote saying "if you can dream it, you can do it". We also made our forkie using our handprint. We can't wait to see what we are making next week!



Iceland

This week in Iceland class, we have started our journey in English. We are writing a warning narrative based on Little Red Riding Hood and have done some drama and a hot seat activity. 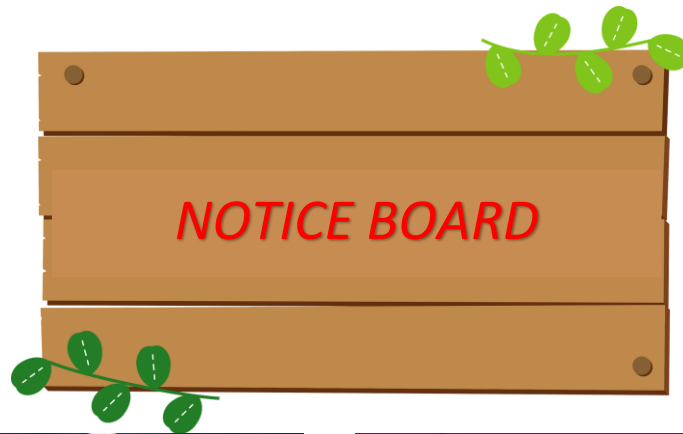
St Lucia

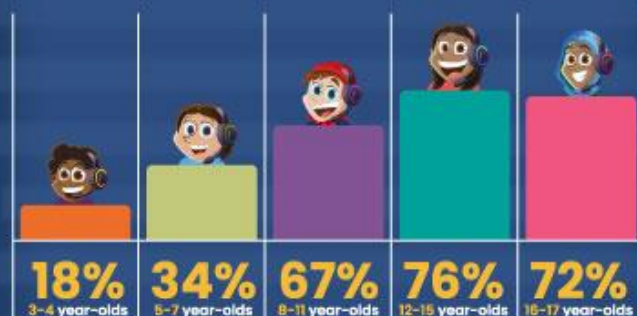
