Just a reminder about our plans for celebrating the King's Coronation – we will be having a Red, White and Blue mufti day next Friday (5th May) and we would like the children to bring in chocolate donations for our chocolate tombola. We are inviting all parents/carers in to school for the afternoon on Friday 26th May where we will be having a Coronation picnic lunch followed by our summer fayre in the afternoon. We have lots of fun things planned including various stalls and games.

The picnic lunch will start at 12:00pm on the school field. You can bring your own picnic in from home, or school can provide your family with a lunch – adult lunches are £3.30 and children are £2.50 unless eligible for Free School Meals / Universal Infant Free School Meals. Please can you let us know by next Friday if you would like a school lunch. If you are planning to bring in your own picnic from home, can I please remind you not to bring in any food that contains nuts as we have children and staff with severe allergies.

It will also be a mufti day on Friday 26th May and we would like children in EYFS & KS1 to bring in tins for the tombola, and KS2 children to bring in cakes. If you are bringing in a homemade cake can you please make sure you provide us with a list of allergens.

THIS WEEK AT BRADING...

Iceland

In English, we have finished writing our warning narrative. The students have created suspenseful and engaging stories using all the writing techniques we have learned over the past two weeks. Our science lesson was focused on air resistance, where the class experimented with different paper airplanes and observed how air resistance affects their flight. For history, we have been looking at Brading's censuses from the past, which has fascinated the class, who are eager to learn more about the history of our local area. In French, we have been practicing answering questions using vrai or faux (true or false), which is improving the comprehension and confidence of the class in French. We have completed the second week of our sailing course, where the class are learning how to sail and are developing their teamwork and communication skills on the boats. In literacy, we have started a new book called Floodland, and we have been making predictions about the book using the front cover, blurb, and first chapter. The class have been practicing their observational skills in art by drawing objects around them using a viewfinder. In computing, we have been using our creativity and problem-solving skills to design and build 3D models.





New Zealand

Year 2 have been looking at mass and capacity in maths. In English, we have been finalising our instruction writing for our potions. Some children have also been retelling traditional tales. In science, we have continued to look at the growth of our beans and we also dissected a bean and looked inside. In history, we travelled back through the decades and compared the 1960s to the present day. In PE, we are continuing to learn tennis and we have been creating pictures using a computer programme in computing. We are also still working hard on our SATs.



Malta

This week in Malta we have spent our maths lessons focusing on the time. The children have been learning to tell the time to the minute. We have continued looking into our Victorian topic and have recognised some key differences between rich and poor people during this era.

Antigua

This week in Antigua class we have continued to look at Spring. We have had lots of fun with spring themed tuff trays. We have planted beans and cress seeds, and had garden centre role play areas, the children have had lots of fun.

Maldives

As our hook for this half term's topic of Land Ahoy, the children found a letter from Mrs Grinling (The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch). The letter asked them to create a map of the IOW as Mr Grinling (the lighthouse keeper) would be visiting the island and needed to find the Needles lighthouse. The children had clues stuck under their chairs of different attractions on the IOW. They had to draw the attraction and locate it on a blank outline of the IOW. The children loved this activity and were excited to find that on Thursday morning Mrs Grinling had written them another note thanking them for their hard work. We have been doing lots of practical maths this week working out mass, capacity and volume. In English the children have written some excellent instructions for how to pack a picnic using plural nouns.

Hawaii

This week Hawaii Class made vegetable wraps. We spoke about our favourite vegetables and other things we like in our wraps. The children chose carrots, broccoli, peppers, tomato and cheese. We added some different seasonings and the children tried the different foods that they wanted to.





Jamaica

This week in year 6 maths, we were revising questions for reasoning tests for the SATs. In English we were revising for the SPAG test. In guided reading we were answering random questions. We played cricket in PE.

Galapagos

Galapagos have started looking at circuits this week! They've had to figure out the components and what works and what doesn't.

St Lucia

This week in St Lucia we have been exploring people who help us, we have been learning about firefighters, putting fires out, doctors, nurses, vets, postal workers and lots more. The children have really enjoyed investigating the different job roles and we now know to call 999 in an emergency!

Cuba

This week in Cuba class we have been focusing on firefighters. We have had lots of fun in our role play area and we even painted our own fire pictures mixing paint together and stamping it with our hands.


