THIS WEEK AT BRADING...

New Zealand

This week, in our Year 2 class, we've embarked on an exciting journey through the pages of "Into the Forest" by Anthony Browne. Our pupils have been captivated by the enchanting world of this book, exploring the vivid illustrations, and delving into the story's mysteries.

In maths, we've been immersing ourselves in the world of numbers, focusing on place value with a particular emphasis on 10s and 1s. The children have been busy counting, grouping, and understanding the significance of each digit in numbers, laying a strong foundation for their mathematical skills.

In History, we've been transported back in time to explore the fascinating parts of a castle. The pupils have learned about the drawbridge, battlements, and moats. They're becoming little historians, uncovering the secrets of these ancient fortifications.

In Science, we've turned our attention to the materials around us. Our curious pupils have been investigating different materials in our classroom, learning about their properties and uses. This hands-on exploration has ignited their scientific curiosity and understanding.

Maldives

Y1 has settled really well into their new class - well done everybody!

We have established class and school rules and are working hard to feed our dojo monsters! We will exchange these at the key point shop at the end of the half term.

In maths, we have been sorting and counting objects. In English, we have been concentrating on capital letters and full stops. In phonics we have been blending and segmenting which will help us to read, write and spell. We have been reading to an adult every day. We have created some lovely artwork for the Horticultural Show.



Malta

This week in Malta class we have had a fantastic week. To kick start a new term, we have introduced our new topic looking at the Stone Age to Iron Age. The children have spent time designing some Stone Age art and have displayed this as part of our "Stone Age campfire". We have also started to look at plants in science and have labelled the 4 key areas of a plant. We haven also spent time looking at Stone Age tools and have built spears which replicate those used in the Stone Age.



Galapagos

Year 4 have had a lot of fun in our first week back. We've started learning all about the Greeks and their myths and living things and their habitats. We've been working hard getting ready for the horticultural show, painting autumnal images and writing our autumn poems. It's been a very busy but very fun week!

For everything else, full training is provided. Training is a combination of online and four short face to face sessions. Our training is fun, informative and informal. The training is great for those who would like to gain new skills, are looking for a change of career direction or looking to gain fantastic work experience. Volunteering looks great on your CV! Once trained all volunteers receive regular support from a named co-ordinator.


All home visiting volunteers are subject to an enhanced DBS check and references are required.
