


WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?	
ANTIGUA	“This week in Antigua class we have had a busy week exploring all things fire works, Diwali and remembrance day. We made firework patterns on tin foil, Rangoli patterns using pasta, pom poms and glitter and some Poppy’s as we talked about remembrance day. We made firework sounds with instruments and did some wonderful Diwali dancing to a variety of Indian music.”
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia, I have been so impressed with how well the children have settled back in after 2 weeks off, Well done! Our focus this week has been Fireworks and Remember, Remember the 5th November. We have made some lovely firework pictures using a range of materials. The children really enjoyed collecting sticks and making a bonfire and adding the flames. They even toasted marshmallows on the fire, be careful not to burn them!
MALDIVES	Year one has had a great first week back. We had a visit from the Fire Service and we were wonderful Brading citizens. We received lots of positive comments about our attitudes and behaviour, so well done everybody. This is our hook to our new topic 'Sparks and Flames' where we will explore 'The Great Fire of London.' In matahs, we have been exploring number bonds within ten. In English we are going to create non-chronological reports all about firefighters. In phonics, we have moved on to phase 4 and are getting stronger at blending and segmenting. In science, we were detectives and went on a science walk to explore what materials were made from. Next week we are off to the cinema so please make sure you have returned your slips
NEW ZEALAND	This week in our Year 2 class, our pupils have embarked on an exciting English journey as we began our diary writing adventure inspired by the beloved book "Where the Wild Things Are." delving into the imaginative world of Max and his wild adventures. In Maths, our pupils have been working diligently on addition and subtraction, honing their mathematical skills. They've tackled various problems and mastered new concepts, demonstrating their mathematical prowess. In preparation for Remembrance Day, our class also engaged in a meaningful project. The pupils came together to create a touching Remembrance Day wreath, fostering a sense of unity and respect for those who have served our country. This activity encouraged them to reflect on the importance of this solemn occasion. It's been a productive week, where our Year 2 pupils have not only honed their academic skills but also shown creativity, compassion, and respect for tradition.
MALTA	This week has been a great week in Malta class. To start the new term, we looked at our new science topic 'animals including humans' and spoke about what a human needs to stay alive. The children spent time creating a healthy food plate and recognised the nutrients that humans need to stay healthy. On Wednesday, we looked at our new topic 'countries and cities'. The children created a map of the United Kingdom and labelled the 4 countries. On Friday, the children took part in our remembrance service and carried a reef that we made earlier in the week. Well done to all the children for a fantastic first week back!
GALAPAGOS	Year 4 have had their hook activities for our Extreme Earth topic this half term. The children came in to find that as a result of the flooding and storms over half term, damage had been caused to the classroom and school! Statements were received by various teachers and we had to piece together the events that occurred that our the school back together. As well as this, children created art pieces for our display board to represent the different types of extreme earth such as a volcano, a tornado and a tsunami. We have also been busy making wreathes for remembrance day.
ICELAND	On Wednesday we had the fire brigade come and talk to us about being safe. We have also learnt what is illegal from the fire people. In P.E. we have/are learning handball, rugby and fitness. We are learning cube numbers and timetables by 10 x 100/1000. In English we are looking at rainforests through 'The Great Kapok Tree'.
JAMAICA	In year six we had a great week full of excitement. In maths, we have been learning about fractions. In English we have been learning about a police report. In Art we have made colourful poppy wreathes for remembrance day. In P.E. we have been learning about how to play handball. In guided reading we have been learning about a poem. In R.E. we were learning about Muslims. In Collective Worship we did peace.
CUBA	This week in Cuba Class we have had a very busy first week back working hard on our letters and numbers. Our topics for this week have been very exciting. We started the week learning all about bonfire night and made our own chalk firework pictures. We then learned about Diwali and made our own Mendhi hand art pictures practicing our mark making skills. Finally, we have finished the week with learning all about remembrance day and collated our own poppies with tissue paper.
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class the children have been thinking hard about their number a place value in maths. They have used a range of resources to order and compare numbers. We have also been thinking about remembrance day and have decorated poppies. The children have been learning the rules of different games and helping each other to play them.

What parents need to know about AGE RATINGS



If you have children, it is understandable to have concerns about the films and TV shows they watch, as well as the games they play. In this guide, we take a look at the two official ways you can assess if a particular title is suitable for your child. Both the BBFC and PEGI have search facilities on their websites that can be used to look up individual titles so you can check their ratings.



RATINGS FOR FILMS, TV & MUSIC VIDEOS

Since 1912, the BBFC (British Board of Film Classification) has informed UK residents of the age suitability of films, TV and music videos - providing parents with the information needed to assess whether or not it is appropriate for their child's age. This applies to cinema releases, DVDs and streaming video services such as Netflix.

WHAT ARE THE BBFC RATINGS?

BBFC ratings are broken down into seven age categories:

 Universal, suitable for all ages	 Parental Guidance required	 Suitable for people aged 12 and over	 Suitable for people aged 12 and over, where some material may be accompanied by an adult
 Suitable for people aged 15 and over	 Suitable for people aged 18 and over	 Adult content only available in specially licensed cinemas and specialist retailers	

WHAT ELSE CAN BBFC REVEAL?

Accompanied with the age suitability rating, BBFC also provide an additional warning regarding the content and what to expect, such as swearing, sexual content, violence and anything you may consider to be inappropriate for your child. In addition to this, the content is also rated in three levels: frequent, mild or strong.

LIMITATIONS OF BBFC RATINGS

It's important to note that there is no obligation on streaming video services to use or display BBFC ratings. Due to this, we advise that you check the rating online before your child streams the content. It may also be a good idea to watch the content first yourself or discuss it with other parents to help you decide whether or not it is suitable for your child.

RATINGS FOR GAMES

PEGI (Pan European Game Information) is a content rating system that ensures all video games are labelled with a minimum age recommendation. These age recommendations are based on the types of content featured within a game. With each game, PEGI also provide a content descriptor that indicates the potential issues and concerns, including sex, violence, bad language and drugs.

WHAT ARE THE PEGI RATINGS?

PEGI ratings are split into age restriction and content descriptors. Additional 'content descriptors' help parents and children to understand the type of content featured within a particular game, including sex, fear, bad language, discrimination, gambling, drugs, violence, and in-game purchases. In combination, the two different ratings can provide a good level of information to help make informed decisions regarding the suitability for your child.

LIMITATIONS OF PEGI RATINGS

It's possible for young people to buy games online without a required proof of age, opening them up to age-inappropriate content without you knowing. We advise that you regularly monitor your child's gaming activities and maintain a honest and healthy dialogue with them about the online world.

PARENTAL CONTROLS

It is a good idea to put in place parental controls for all online accounts which your child may use to purchase or download online games e.g. The App Store, Google Play Store, PlayStation Store and Microsoft Xbox Store etc.



Appointments must be booked in advance using the National Booking Service, we are unable to offer walk-ins.

Children are eligible if:

- they have an immunosuppressed disorder
- or have close family contact with someone who has an immunosuppressed disorder
- or have not had any COVID vaccination in the past.




Kids Afternoon Pottery Club


